

## Kandiland Pullers - Rules

The reason we meet from time to time to show and pull classic tractors is to enjoy the fellowship and friendship of people who share an interest in preserving the past while having fun. The tractor pull will be successful as long as we place friendship, fellowship and enjoyment ahead of competition. These rules are intended to provide tractor pulls that are safe, fair, and enjoyable for all.

The following rules include antique and classic tractors for weight classes as follows:

#3500, #4000, #4500, #5000, #5500, #6000, #6500, #7500, #8500, #9500, #10500, #11500, #12500

1. Tractors must be 40 yrs old or older.
2. Tractors may pull in up to 4 classes, once in each class.
3. Maximum tire size up to and including are as follows for 3 MPH class.  
#4500 class - 13.6 x 38, 14.9 x 28  
#5000 - #6500 class - 14.9 x 38, 15.5 x 38, 16.9 x 34  
#7500 - #8500 class - 18.4 x 38, 16.9 x 38, 18.4 x 28  
Maximum tire size of 38"  
Radial tires are allowed  
Absolutely NO cut tires  
\*6 MPH class in any weight bracket has no tire size regulation, BUT cannot use cut tires.
4. Stamped steel rims are allowed. No aluminum rear wheels allowed.
5. #3500 - #8500 classes have a choice of either 3 mph or 6 mph. Class speed chosen will be the speed you pull in every class you enter.  
#9500 - #12500 max speed is 6 mph  
Torques may be used.  
You are allowed 1 warning horn for exceeding the speed limit. The second horn results in being 'red flagged'.
6. There will be no more than 1% overage allowed in each weight class. Suitcase weights and custom weight brackets are permitted. Front weight bracket and weights, to extend no further than 11' from center of rear axel. Rear weights may not extend beyond the plane of the rear tires. Exceptions will be made on standard tractors.

7. Engines must be factory appearing. Only factory turbos are allowed.
8. Draw bars must not exceed 20" in height, or less than 18" from the center of the rear axel to the hooking point. No part of the draw bar may extend beyond the hook point. Draw bars must be stationary in all directions and have a 3" hole or clevis.
9. Any item falling off the tractor while hooked to the skid, will result in disqualification.
10. Drivers must be 16 years of age. Drivers will be seated at all times.
11. No alcohol in the pit area.
12. Check with promoters to verify registration and weigh in details.
13. Cost will be \$20 per hook.
